Mileage Instructions

Under the Michigan No-Fault Act, injured persons are entitled to mileage. This is paid on a per mile basis and varies from company to company. Usually the rates are from .17 per mile to .58 per mile.

*Mileage is ALWAYS from your house and back to your house -even if you, yourself are at another destination to begin with

*Mileage <u>CAN</u> only be counted for the following, WITH regard to injuries sustained from this accident only:

-doctor's appointments

-physical therapy

-MRI/CT appointments

-pharmacy, to pick up prescription related to this accident

*The following are examples of what mileage can <u>NOT</u> be counted for:

-grocery shopping -friend's house -church -bank -attorney

-doctor's visits unrelated to injuries from this accident

*Mileage is round trip (from your house and back to your house)

*Mileage should be filled out each month and turned in at the 1st of each month

*Mileage forms should be signed and dated by whomever is doing the driving

*Your claim number should be on each mileage sheet
